PM with ms notes. Ristretto re the appointment of a vic. ap. in Nova Scotia, prepared for the CG of 21 May 1821 followed by a Sommario. In his letter of 8 Jan. 1821 (see Sommario, no. 1), Plessis, abp. of Québec, informed of the death of Burke, bp. of Sion, vic. ap. in Nova Scotia (29 Nov. [1820]), and of the appointment of Carroll as administrator of the vicariate. The abp. also repeated his project of 17 Nov. 1819 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, IV 194] to unite New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. The writer mentions that, on this latter point, Plessis did not send any further details, although requested to do so [on 14 Apr. 1821]. The CG of 7 Sept. 1819 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 42] asked the Pope [Pius VII] to appoint Maguire, a Halifax priest, as Burke's coadjutor. The brief of 1 Oct. 1819 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, IV 167-168] appointed Maguire, but the latter renounced on 6 Jan. 1821 (see Sommario, no. 2). On 2 Dec. 1820 the writer wrote to the abp. of Dublin (Troy [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, V 113]) to

convince Long to accept the appointment, but the abp.'s letter of 18 Jan. 1821 (see Sommario, no. 3), informed that Long refused the appointment due to his age and to the [Halifax] climate. Both the abp. of Dublin and Murphy, bp. of Cork, now suggest Lyons for the position. Lyons, 29, taught for Cook Sewivary and for three years was the confessor of the three years in the Ursulines. The information on him (see Sommario, no. 4) is very satisfactory. If selected, however, Lyons must be dispensed by the impediment of his young age. R [in Pedicini's handwriting] No decision is to be made until a letter from the abp. of Québec is received. Signed by Fontana, Pedicini. Reference is made to Raby's deposition [of 6 Sept. 1819; see SOCG 103]; Raby, parish priest of Saint-Antoine-de-Tilly, maintains that a maid [Gaudin] told him that Ffrench tried to seduce her, to no avail (see Sommario, no. A/4). Evidence is circumstantial, yet the abp. of Québec [Plessis] on 6 Sept. 1820 notified the PF Prefect [Fontana] that he withdrew Ffrench's spiritual powers for immoral behaviour [on 15 June 1817; see item 2 of SOCG 41] (see Sommario no. A/5). Ffrench's scandalous conduct is confirmed by the abp. of Baltimore [Maréchal]'s letter of 18 Sept. 1819 (see Sommario no. A/3/e). The bp. of New York [Connolly] supports Ffrench and justifies his actions (see Sommario no. B/1). R, signed by Ercolani: As far as Ffrench is

concerned (no. 5), he must leave the diocese [of

[a]bp. of [Québec in] Canada [Plessis] and his missionaries have no knowledge of Celt and English nor acquainted with Scottish or Irish are institutions. In fact, the bp.'s visit of 1812 to

Prince Edward Island was the first since the Conquest [1760]; there a priest must know English, French and Celt. In that period, only two Scottish priests were educated [in Quebec, B.D. Macdonald, Ronald Macdonald], one of whom is currently in Cape Breton [B.D. Macdonald], the other still in Canada. To date, all Scottish missionaries who preached in Nova Scotia and Cape Breton Island were sent from the Scottish Highlands, eight of whom accompanied emigrants. The writer recommends that the new vic. ap. in Nova Scotia be Fraser, a missionary fluent in Celt and English, with experience in the Scottish Highlands, in Cape Breton (the writer's companion of the previous year [1823]), currently in Nova Scotia. The bp. of Arindela, vic. ap. [in the Scottish Highlands, R. MacDonald], must be consulted on the candidate. A letter from the abp. of Québec to the writer of 12 Jan. 1824 is profusely cited. The CG of 23 Sept. 1817 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 35] deferred a new subdivision of the diocese, yet Plessis was appointed abp. in the CG of 23 Nov. 1818 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 39]. At the same time, McDonell and MacEachern were appointed vic.s general, suffragan and auxiliary bp.s in Upper

Canada, and in Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Iles de la Madeleine. When the [English] Secretary of State for [War and] the Colonies, Lord Bathurst, complained about Plessis's new title, the CG of 24 Jan. 1820 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 46] allowed him not to use it, at the same time appointing Lartigue and Provencher vic.s general, suffragan and auxiliary bp.s in Montreal and in the North, while Cape Breton [Island] was joined to MacEachern's jurisdiction. Later, the CG of 24 Feb. 1823 [see Acta 61], ruled out the erection of new bishoprics which had been suggested by Lartique in 1821 and MacEachern [in his letter of 9 Nov. 1819; see SOCG 152], on account of the British government's opposition, although the latter was mainly aimed at the appointment of an In Mar. [1825] McDonell went to Rome to ask for the erection of a bishopric in Upper Canada. Plessis's letter to Poynter of 29 Aug. 1824 [see Sommario, no. IV; and in SOCG 184] is transcribed, which shows that the government is not opposed to the erection of the new bishopric. Poynter, who had forwarded it to Gradwell, Rector of the English College in Rome and his own procurator, on 2 Nov. 1824, mentioned Stuart, the new Protestant bp. [of .....], and the fact that Bathurst, who knows that McDonell is "absolutely necessary to keep good order in Upper Canada," has disbursed in the past "large amounts of money" to him and has recently

paid all his back dues. To the Pro-Prefect [della Somaglia]'s letter of 27 Nov. [1824], Poynter answered on 21 Dec. [1824] (see Sommario, no I [also <u>SOCG</u> 188]), and again on 8 Feb. Burke was appointed bp. of Sion, vic. ap. in Nova Scotia, in the CG of 19 Aug. 1817 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 33], replaced by Fraser in the CG of 29 Nov. 1824 [see Acta 75]. The CG of 23 SEtp. 1817 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 35] deferred a new subdivision of the diocese, yet Plessis was appointed abp. in the CG of 23 Nov. 1818 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 39]. At time, McDonell and MacEachern were the same appointed vic.s general, suffragan and auxiliary bp.s in Upper Canada, and in Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Iles de la Madeleine. When the [English] Secretary of State for [War and] the Colonies, Lord Bathurst, complained about Plessis's new title, the CG of 24 Jan. 1820 [see Codignola, Calendar 1800-20, II 46] allowed him not to use it, at the same time appointing Lartique and Provencher vic.s general, suffragan and auxiliary bp.s in Montréal and in the North, while Cape Breton [Island] was joined to MacEachern's jurisdiction. Later, the CG of 24 Feb. 1823 [see Acta 61], ruled out the erection of new bishoprics which had been suggested by Lartigue in 1821 and MacEachern [in his letter of 9 Nov. 1819; see SOCG 152], on account of the British government's opposition, although the latter was mainly aimed at the appointment of an abp.. In Mar. [1825] McDonell went to Rome to ask for the erection of a bishopric in Upper Canada. Plessis's letter to Poynter of 29 Aug. 1824 [see Sommario, no. IV; and in SOCG 184] is transcribed, which shows government is not opposed to the erection of the new bishopric. Poynter, who had forwarded it to Gradwell, Rector of the English College in Rome and his own procurator, on 2 Nov. 1824, mentioned Stuart, the new Protestant bp. [of .....], and the fact that Bathurst, who knows that McDonell is "absolutely necessary to keep good order in Upper Canada," has disbursed in the past "large amounts

of money" to him and has recently paid all his back dues. To the Pro-Prefect [della Somaglia]'s letter of 27 Nov. [1824], Poynter answered on 21 Dec. [1824] (see Sommario, no. II [also SOCG 186]), repeating that Bathurst is not opposed to the erection of the new bishopric, but has asked the Governor [in-Chief of Canada, Dalhousie]'s opinion. When McDonell arrived in Rome, on 25 Mar. 1825 he was asked to state his case in writing. McDonell did so in his M [of Apr. 1825] (see Sommario, no. III [also SOCG 183], and showed Plessis's letter of 29 Aug. 1824 (see Sommario, no. IV [also in SOCG 184(). In his M. McDonell, who does not seem to be current in some British political affairs, describes births, emigration from Scotland and Ireland, conversions, revenues of the future bishopric, a seminary being built, seven churches (there were two [in 1804]), seven priests (one in 1804), one student in Québec, four or five students with the Sulpicians in Montréal. The new bishopric will establish its see in Kingston, and a slight change of borders will be necessary. He attaches the most recent letter received from Plessis. [2] C [in Poynter's handwriting] Plessis to Poynter, Québec, 1825. The writer acknowledges the addressee's letters of 20 Dec. [1824] and 24 Jan. [1825], the latter destroying the hopes raised in the former re the erection of a bishopric in Montréal, a district where there already is a seminary and more Catholics than in Upper Canada. While he rejoices at the subdivision of his diocese, he believes McDonell is "somewhat blinded" by his desired to be a bp., forgetting that the [English] government will not allow Jesuits into Upper Canada and will select McDonell's successor in case of his death. L700 he had when he arrived in Canada [in 18..] he invested in land, and 20 years later, "by a judicious selection of advantagious situations, good management & rigid economy," they became "a respectable property," to which 2,400 acres of land were added by the British He also hs two large farms (let to government. tenants for a yearly return of half of the produce of land and livestock), other farms (let for small yearly rent), two mills (let for half the proceeds). The above properties returned every year 1,000-1,200 bushels of grain, besides milk, butter, cheese, beef, mutton, pork, enough to maintain 20-30 students and teachers. In Kingston, the writer owns land and a house that can yield L 3,000 a year in rent, and just before he left Canada [in 18..] he sold two acres of that property for L 1,400. As the value of property in Kingston is increasing, the value of his property is increasing too. Furthrmore, tythes from Glengarry County for the year he left Canada enabled the writer to maintain his family, the seminary, and to sell 1,300 bushels of wheat, 800 bushels of oats, 400 bushels of peas, 200 bushels of Indian corn. As to the clergy, to the one priest he had left in Canada [....] 'nе added two more [.....], three seminarians just completed their third year, and three more will return with Rome delays, however, could him from Europe. jeopardize the success of the whole enterprise. The British government will not pay to a vic. general the L 400 per annum promised to a bp. in Upper Canada, and his properties will be inherited by his family. Furthermore, Lord Bathurst's "kind disposition" will be offended by an "impolite" attitude on the part of the Holy See.

Furthermore, while Lower Canada has only Frenchspeaking inhabitans and a French canon law, the opposite (English) is true in Upper Canada, a fact that makes the bp. of Telmissus [Lartigue]'s position an anomalous one. Were McDonell to be appointed, the Sulpicians promised the erection of a seminary in Upper Canada. Also, although his reasons are not known to the writer, Lord Bathurst is known to want an immediate dependence on the Holy See for McDonell. [The balance of this item deals with the United States].
