

The Petition of *Barnard Vanalstine* of the Township of *13*
Kingston in the *Mitland* District, Province of Upper
 Canada, **Humbly Sheweth**, that your Petitioner is the son of *Lambert Vanalstine*
 of the Township of *Sudbury* in the *Mitland*
 District, a U. E. LOYALIST; that your Petitioner has attained the age of Twenty-one years, and
 has taken the oath of Allegiance, as appears by the annexed certificate; and has never received any
 Land or order for Land from the Crown: Your Petitioner, therefore prays, that your *Excellency*
 will be pleased to grant unto *him* two Hundred Acres of the waste Lands
 of the Crown, and permit to be *his* Agent to locate
 the same, and to receive the Patent when completed. And as in duty bound will ever pray.
